

Brief Description	The group had gotten its big break by winning a local talent show, and landing a spot as the opening act for The Dave Clark 5, who were touring the U. S. at the time. In order to win the competition, the band recruited a lead singer with a soulful voice. Hear the lead vocals of Chuck Cockerham on Disk # 6 with his original composition, "I Love You." Another cut found on disk # 14 is a wonderful cover of Leon Heywood's, "It's Got To Be Mellow." Issued as C C & Souls, the 1966 cuts showcase Cockerham's talent already budding early in his performing career. Chuck Cockerham is best known for his 1969 Bell/ Mala juggernaut soul anthem "Have I Got A Right" After a brief solo career, Cockerham has mostly resided as a stalwart anchor member of Bill Pinkney's Original Drifters group.
