Brief Description	The Wilmington, NC group formed in 1957 and disbanded in 1965. The group was fronted by Buddy Skipper on vocals with key contributions from an impressive list of talent over the years, including Russell Carter, Ray Hawke, Bill Sparks and Tommy Hicks — exerting a huge influence on the band was Concord, NC native Marshall Sehorn, who not only filled in on various instruments on occasion, but helped place the act with a major independent label in New York, Fire/Fury Records — Sehorn went on to a stellar career in New Orleans, pairing up with Allen Toussaint, to produce some of the greatest tracks ever released in the Crescent City. Hear "No More Doggin'" on Disk # 2 on The Soundtrack to The Heeey Baby Days.
