Brief Description	<p>Nomads gained a reputation as a band that played great music and put on a great show. The greatest irony was the fact that all the members of the band were still in high school! Throughout 1967, Little Harold and the Fabulous Nomads became a strong force in the southeastern soul-beach music scene and began writing and performing original music.</p> <p>By 1968, Little Harold and the Fabulous Nomads had performed with the likes of Sonny Turner and the Platters, Mitch Ryder and the Detroit Wheels, Willie Tee, The Original Drifters, The Tams, and Ben E. King. Twenty Years after Little Harold & The Nomads played their last gig and reformed as The Southwinds and receive a nomination for best new beach band but broke up shortly thereafter. Stay tunes, they still may not be through.</p>
